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

#### **Policy:**
















The above graph indicates the ratio of male and female admissions. It can be easily analyzed that the ratio of male students (27%) was very low in the last five years when it was compared to the admitted female students. The ratio of male and female students' admissions in the last five years is slightly fluctuating. In the analysis for the academic year 2017-18 to 2021-22, the percentage of male students is on average 45%, whereas the female ratio is 55%. The percentage of girl students was about 10% high, it is was observed that college provides facilities and gender promotion activity-based education.









It is a gender-sensitive campus and the gender balance is well maintained. The overall academic performance of girls is better than boys both at UG and PG levels.

#### Suggestions:

2) Awareness programs on legal rights should organize regularly after intervals.

3) There should be a sanitary napkin vending machine and disposal machine installed on the college campus.
